


I wanted to focus on the aspects of Toa Payoh central through introducing the starting area of Toa Payoh central. Since I lived in Serangoon, I would take the bus 105 (image below) to Toa Payoh and the first piece of architecture I would see is the Seu Teck Sean Tong Temple (picture above).



On page 3, I showed how the older generation interacted within Toa Payoh central. The picture below shows elderly sitting at the bus interchange and chatting to each other. This is a common sight in Toa Payoh central. And the picture at the top shows an old lady buying dim sum at Tiong bahru Pau, which is one of the first few dim sum shops that I have ever eaten from.

These 3 images were taken at Toa Payoh Vista Market, a wet market that I used to visit with my parents every weekend when I was young.



Having seen these shops as a kid, I am always fascinated by the variety of tools that they offered, and even now when I revisit this market, these stalls are still open for business, and the nostalgia strikes when I think that these items are not really used by households now. with technological advancements. and yet they are still here with all the same items.

It shows how Toa Payoh is really a time capsule, allowing me to relive my child-like emotions when I revisit.

# **FINAL** (pg 6 & 7)

The last spread focuses on the living area near my old house, which was block 60 at Toa payoh Lorong 4. Being a very old estate, the architecture in Toa Payoh is very old. and some parts of it are extremely unique, such as the picture at the bottom of a void deck with a triangular roof. To enhance the "oldness", many older people still live there, and I managed to capture their casual routine and how they interact with each other.







I also chose to focus on architecture because these flats have been here since I started living in Toa Payoh, and no matter how much they have been repainted to change its image, the architecture style of it still remains the same. which makes me feel like I have not left at all. # STYLE




# STICKERS!!
