## PRIMARY

or absolute homelessness, described as chronic street homelessness; being "roofless".

## SECONDARY

also known as being "houseless". People living in transitional or temporal accommodation.

## TERTIARY

refers to people at risk of becoming homeless, or those living in inadequate or insecure accommodation.
