I developed interest for my chosen topic as it is a real life issue in Singaporean online culture. We have a Singapore-based online journalism platform known as Straits Times Online Mobile Print, STOMP. Although it is managed by one of Singapore’s biggest publishing houses, Singapore Press Holdings (SPH), everything submitted to STOMP from citizen with little moderation. In this manner, it provides a certain anonymous freedom of speech for the Singapore citizens in a country which has been known to be “forthright in... restricting the press”.

The controversy for STOMP kicks in as seen in the petition to try and close down STOMP. While initially intended to be uniquely Singapore, it is now used for Singaporeans to “post pictures of their fellow citizens up to no good”, “complain about... a couple hugging at a bus stoop or a pizza that is fractionally smaller than advertised”, showing the ugly voyeuristic and arrogant side of Singaporeans.

I was interested in how something simple could end up as a mechanism that revealed the ugliness of human nature. As I partake on this project, I want to both question this internet platform and also point out the ill nature of humans in the way that they abuse each other just because they *can*.

I plan to approach the topic in the form of a graphic novel (and if my skills allow, perhaps a web comic so that the reach will be further). I hope that the eerie images that I bring to the table will be able to strike a chord in the readers. The use of graphic novel might allow many to slip into the story and to disturbingly, identify with the character that chooses morally questionable choices, and then later on question themselves.
