Cosmopolitanism

Citizenship is the glue keeping individual and state together.



Passport Cover


Passport is standardised and issued by the United Nations as opposed to a specific country.

The usual national crest is replaced by the UN logo, which symbolises placing a greater importance on the entire humanity over state.



Multiculturalism

The UN's statement regarding the safe passage of the passport bearer into the country is reflected in the six official languages of the UN. These are Arabic, Chinese, English, French, Russian and Spanish. The correct interpretation and translation of these six languages, in both spoken and written form, is very important to the work of the Organization, because this enables clear and concise communication on issues of global importance.



Wave Motif

The undulating lines symbolise the interconnectedness of the world. Gone are the nationalistic symbolisms that are commonplace in current passport designs. Perhaps passport bearers could in the future be allowed to choose which images or symbolisms to include in their passport design that they think best represents themselves. The passport is no longer purely a national identity but weaves in personal identity that is understandably unique and nuanced.



Citizenship
